Chris Moore

Chris Moore is a 16 year veteran of the Phoenix Police Department. Chris was certified as a peace officer in 1991 and was assigned to the Central City Precinct upon graduation from the police academy. He worked patrol in South and Central Phoenix for 4 years, serving as Field Training Officer in the South Mountain Precinct. In 1995, Chris was assigned to the Northern Traffic Division as a solo motorcycle officer. Over the next four years Chris worked primarily traffic/DUI/collision investigation, with an emphasis on youth alcohol and education enforcement and education. In 1999 Chris returned to the patrol division, Squaw Peak Precinct, awaiting promotion.

In July 2000, Chris was promoted to Sergeant and served once again in the South Mountain Precinct. From 2001 to the spring of 2004, Chris served as the supervisor of a field training squad responsible for training newly appointed officers. Chris then returned as a supervisor in the Squaw Peak Precinct. In January of 2006, Chris transferred to the Vehicular Crimes Unit as a Detective Sergeant. This detail is tasked with investigating nearly 300 cases involving serious injury or death.

In November 2007, Chris volunteered for a temporary assignment to the police academy to serve as a Basic Training Sergeant for an academy class of all Phoenix Police recruits.

Chris has taught extensively within the Drug Recognition Training Program, Firearms, academy and advanced level training throughout the Valley.
